Enneagram—Beyond the Basics

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 22, 6:30-8:30 P.M. & SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 23, 9:30 A.M. – 3 P.M., BLOEDEL HALL

Facilitated by Kaye Bernard, Fee is \$50 for the two-day workshop, which includes Saturday breakfast and lunch.

The Enneagram is an ancient personality typing system composed of nine personality styles or “types.” Each of us gravitates to and adopts one of these styles in childhood. Every style inhabits a distinct worldview and set of motivations that influence how a person moves through the world. For this workshop, Friday evening is accessible to those with no prior experience with the Enneagram, but will also be beneficial for those who have worked with it before. Saturday will dive deeper into the Enneagram. This experiential workshop will illuminate how nine personality types relate to each other. Knowing another’s way of looking at the world and the underlying motivations of each type can help us understand how and why we are different from one another. Together we’ll explore contrasting tendencies within the Emotional and Thinking Centers of our own ‘Body Intelligence’, learning to correlate the high and low side of each type’s Passions/Virtues and Fixations/Holy Ideas. Employing the “higher aspects” of all types is essential when using the Enneagram for transformation. Register at saintmarks.org/wisdomschool.

CONSTRUCTION CORNER

What's happening on the construction site?

There have been some exciting developments on the construction site lately! Painting has begun on Bloedel Hall. You'll also notice that scaffolding has been installed on the south wall to begin the window work there. Demolition and replacement of the front patio will begin the week of August 28, and will be completed in two phases so that access to the cathedral and to Thomsen Chapel will be maintained throughout.

Why is it so noisy in the Nave?

Windows have been removed on the north and east side of the Cathedral, and new windows will not be in place until September. So we're an "open air" cathedral for the summer.

Jim Wallis: Race, Privilege, and the Bridge to a New America

SEPTEMBER 16, 7 P.M., MARION OLIVER MCCAW HALL

Join the Treacy Levine Center for an evening with Jim Wallis as he explores the topic of his latest book, *America's Original Sin; Racism, White Privilege, and the Bridge to a New America*. The author of ten previous books covering issues of social justice viewed through the lens of religious faith, Wallis' latest book is the one he has described as the book he always wanted to write. In it, he offers an analysis of America's historical racism—its treatment of the indigenous population and its enslavement of Africans—and the lasting and devastating legacy brought about by what he calls "America's original sin." Describing himself as white, Christian, and evangelical, Wallis sees it as his faith's obligation to "support the poor and vulnerable and defend those under attack." He offers this path forward as a way to change our course: "Tell the truth... love our neighbor... welcome the stranger... expose and oppose racial profiling... defend Muslims... It is time to listen."
