Peace Rally on Anniversary of "I Have a Dream" speech

Members of Saint Mark's Cathedral have been invited by leaders of historically-black churches in Seattle to attend a peaceful gathering and rally on the 54th anniversary of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s speech at the Lincoln Memorial. Drawing on the Civil Rights movement of the 1960s for inspiration, this event seeks to protest with our best values as people of faith, celebrating human dignity and equality as the sure foundation of a society set upon the arc of the moral universe bending toward justice.

The Enneagram—Beyond the Basics

Facilitated by Kaye Bernard, Fee is \$50 for the two-day workshop, which includes Saturday breakfast and lunch.

The Enneagram is an ancient personality typing system composed of nine personality styles or "types." Every style inhabits a distinct worldview and set of motivations that influence how a person moves through the world. This experiential workshop will illuminate how nine personality types relate to each other. Knowing another's way of looking at the world and the underlying motivations of each type can help us understand how and why we are different from one another. Together we'll explore contrasting tendencies within the Emotional and Thinking Centers of our own 'Body Intelligence,' learning to correlate the high and low side of each type's Passions/Virtues and Fixations/Holy Ideas. CONSTRUCTION CORNER

What's happening on the construction site?

Our window installer, Herzog Glass, made a site visit to the factory that is producing the nave windows, using a Dip Tech Printer and other machinery. Above, you can see photos showing the glass sheets with coloring applied, and mullions that will resemble the original windows in character. The first windows will be installed in about four weeks time. And, progress is being made on the elevator annex. Concrete was poured on the Nave level this week. Finally, demolition and replacement of the front patio will begin next week, and will be completed in two phases so that access to the cathedral and to Thomsen Chapel will be maintained throughout.
