In December 2016, Saint Mark's Vestry unanimously adopted a Statement of Commitment and Action which reaffirmed Saint Mark's commitment to respect the dignity of every human being, strive for justice and peace among all people, and seek and serve Christ in all persons. This was adopted out of concern about the increase in statements and actions in our nation that target particular groups of people based on their skin color, their religious affiliation, their gender or orientation, their disabilities, or their country of birth. We pledged to work toward a better vision, and in the last nine months, countless members of Saint Mark's community have put these statements into action, as a network of activists, in God's name, joining others who similarly pledge to actively pursue justice. Join us in Bloedel Hall to learn about the progress of this effort, and learn how you can participate as you feel called.

TODAY, 9 & 11 A.M. SERVICES





The Enneagram is a personality typing system composed of nine styles or “types.” Each style inhabits a distinct worldview and set of motivations that influence how a person moves through the world. This experiential workshop will illuminate how the types relate to one another, helping us to understand how other types look at the world. Together we'll explore contrasting tendencies within the Emotional and Thinking Centers of our own ‘Body Intelligence’, learning to correlate the high and low side of each type's Passions/Virtues and Fixations/Holy Ideas. Education for Ministry is the Episcopal Church's most in-depth adult Christian education course for lay people. EfM is a program of The School of Theology at Sewanee, and admission requires a commitment to attend weekly seminars and spend time on study and preparation weekly during the academic year (September-June).
