Anticipating Fall Weather in the Cathedral—Steps taken to address the cooler weather during construction

The good news: cathedral windows have begun arriving, and installation will begin on Monday morning. The bad news? The windows are not installed yet, and it will take several weeks to completely accomplish that exciting work. To address the cooler weather, Turner Construction has brought in several portable heaters which will be in use on the south side of the Nave, so if you're needing extra warmth, please sit on that side. In the coming weeks, a special shrink wrap will be placed in the remaining window openings to offer additional protection from the elements. We've had an "open air cathedral" experience all summer, and these next few weeks will offer us our "Northern European cathedral" experience—all part of the memories of being a part of this generation caring for this special building. We continue our worship of God in this place, even while wearing layers like the hardy Pacific Northwesters we are. We appreciate your patience!
