Education for Ministry is the Episcopal Church's most in-depth adult Christian education course for lay people. Study the Bible, history, theology, and connect faith and life experiences through theological reflection. EfM is a program of The School of Theology at Sewanee, and admission requires a solid commitment to attend the weekly seminars and spend between two and four hours in study and preparation weekly during the academic year (September-June), in either the Monday morning group or Monday evening group. It is a four-year program, but students commit to one year at a time. The evening course, (Mondays at 6:30 p.m.) has space for a few more first year students. Interested?
