The concrete for the new patio is now completely poured, but the asphalt repairs to the front drive and around the base of the steps is scheduled for early next week (weather permitting). The temporary ramp we've been using the last few weeks has been removed, and **the entry has been moved to the south side** of the building. There are signs and lighting marking this new (temporary) path. The full patio will open after new handrails are installed later in January.
