Storytelling as Social Conscience

Our bodies and identities are socially and culturally constructed. We are gendered, racialized, sexualized, politicized, represented, colonized, contained, controlled, and inscribed. As a result of the relationship between our lived experiences and our social actions, we may be both shaped by, and resist, social and cultural constructions. Participants will develop an autobiography of self (e.g., a poem, collage, song, etc.) connecting "private troubles" with "public issues." That is to recognize that your identity is a reflection of (and perhaps a resistance to) society, culture, and politics, all of which have, to a certain extent, shaped our experiences.
