Storytelling as Social Conscience

Our bodies and identities are socially and culturally constructed. As a result of the relationship between our lived experiences and our social actions, we may be both shaped by, and resist, social and cultural constructions. Participants will develop an autobiography of self (e.g., a poem, collage, song, etc.) connecting "private troubles" with "public issues." That is to recognize that your identity is a reflection of (and perhaps a resistance to) society, culture, and politics, all of which have, to a certain extent, shaped our experiences. Stations of the Cross—Sculptural Reliefs by Virginia Maksymowicz

LENT 2018 (FEB. 14-MARCH 30), EVENT IS FREE

From Ash Wednesday through Good Friday, 2018, Saint Mark's will exhibit Virginia Maksymowicz's *Stations of the Cross*, cast sculptural reliefs in a tradition of religious imagery that dates back to the 13th century. Maksymowicz worked with a variety of models, culled from a wide range of ages



and ethnicities. She explains, "I wanted the narrative of Christ's passion and death to be represented in a way that is tensioned between the "specific" and the "universal." Bishop Rickel names Chris McPeak and Malcolm McLaurin as Postulants for Holy Orders

On the Feast of Epiphany, Chris McPeak (our Worship Coordinator) and Malcolm McLaurin (our Canon for Youth and Young Adult Ministries) were named as postulants in this diocese. Postulancy is the phase of preparation, under the direction of the bishop, as they continue discerning their calls to be priests in the Church. Chris graduated last June from seminary and will continue his formation and work here at Saint Mark's until a later date, when he will be assigned to another parish by the bishop to continue his preparations. Malcolm and his family will begin exploring seminaries to attend, where he will engage a three-year Master of Divinity program, after which he will return to the diocese to be ordained. We celebrate both their ministries here, and while their next steps in ministry formation will prompt changes in their areas of ministry at Saint Mark's, we recognize and give thanks for their answering God's call in this way, and bless them in all this.

CONSTRUCTION CORNER

The **elevator** is now operational, as are the **power doors** into Narthex (southernmost doors) and into the office suite (to be renamed the Hoerster Annex).

The **stone work** on external walls is nearly complete. Caulking requires dry weather so this will likely take a few more weeks. The trailer on the front lawn has been removed, and the lawn will be reseeded as weather permits. Landscaping will begin around perimeter of cathedral in the coming weeks. **Hand rails** for the east terrace (front patio) are in fabrication and will be installed this month. **Asphalt repairs** and restriping of the south lot will occur once all the construction workers have completed other aspects of the project. We appreciate your patience as we draw this major project to a close.
