From Ash Wednesday through Good Friday, Saint Mark's will exhibit Virginia Maksymowicz's *Stations of the Cross*, cast sculptural reliefs in a tradition of religious imagery that dates back to the 13th century. Maksymowicz worked with a variety of models, culled from a wide range of ages and ethnicities. She explains, "I wanted the narrative of Christ's passion and death to be represented in a way that is tensioned between the "specific" and the "universal." Audio guides will make them accessible to visually impaired people as well. Audio and text guides embedded in a mobile app offer visitors several meditations to accompany their experience.
