Sunday Forum: A Conversation with Virginia Maksymowicz

Throughout Lent, Virginia Maksymowicz's *Stations of the Cross* will be exhibited in the Cathedral Nave. Virginia will be on hand to talk about ways of engaging with visual art as a spiritual practice. From Ash Wednesday through Good Friday, Saint Mark's will exhibit Virginia Maksymowicz's *Stations of the Cross*, cast sculptural reliefs in a tradition of religious imagery that dates back to the 13th century. Maksymowicz worked with a variety of models, culled from a wide range of ages and ethnicities. She explains, "I wanted the narrative of Christ's

passion and death to be represented in a way that is tensioned between the 'specific' and the 'universal.' Audio guides will make them accessible to visually impaired people as well. Audio and text guides embedded in a mobile app offer visitors several meditations to accompany their experience. 
