The Rev. Ed Bacon is our guest preacher today

We welcome The Rev. Ed Bacon as our preacher this morning. He is an Episcopal priest who retired in 2016 after more than twenty years as rector of All Saints' Church in Pasadena, California, where his commitment to "inclusive compassion and justice for everyone" informed his transformative leadership in the largest congregation in the Episcopal Church. He marks a meeting with Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in 1967 as shaping his worldview, and his ministry ever since. He was named Whiteside Distinguished Preacher by Candler School of Theology at Emory University, and he was awarded honorary doctorates from Church Divinity School of the Pacific and Mercer University. He has appeared on Oprah television and radio, and he is the author of *Eight Habits of Love: Open Your Heart, Open Your Mind*. He continues to preach and teach around the world since retiring to Birmingham, Alabama with his wife Hope.

Cathedral Book Group

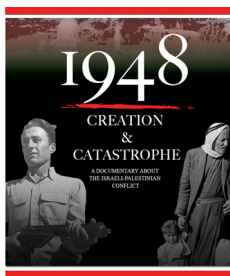
