## **Messiaen's *Quartet for the End of Time***

Composed in 1941 while captive in a Nazi prisoner of war camp, Olivier Messiaen's sublime *Quartet for the End of Time* is considered to be one of the great masterpieces of the 20th century and a deeply spiritual work contemplating faith, time, and love. Featuring Luke Fitzpatrick, violin; Rose Bellini, cello; James Falzone, clarinet; Jesse Myers, piano. ## MLK50: Where Do We Go From Here?

WED, APRIL 4, 4:07 p.m. Ringing of Bells, Cathedral Nave, 7 p.m. Cathedral Commons, Bloedel Hall

On April 4, all eyes will turn to Memphis, TN as we remember the tragic event that occurred 50 years prior and the legacy left by our nation's greatest peacemaker. All are invited to join in the Nave at 4:07 p.m. to ring our bell 39 times, once for each year of Dr. King's life. This is organized by the National Civil Rights Museum at the site of the Lorraine Motel. They will start at 6:01 p.m. local time. Memphis churches will join at 6:03, and we will join churches throughout the country four minutes later. In another 4 minutes bells will begin to ring internationally. If you can't make it to Saint Marks, please step outside or into the nearest church to mark this seminal anniversary. The Cathedral Commons conversation at 7 p.m. will consider the theme for this commemorative event: 'MLK50: Where do we go from here?' This is the title of his last book and a speech delivered August 16, 1967. We will also share some plans that are forming to commemorate the passing of a local civil rights leader, Edwin Pratt.
