## **Sunday Forum: Even in Victory—The Mideast Focus Film Series**

This annual offering of films includes documentaries and feature narratives which focus on personal stories from both sides of the conflict in the Middle East. In this year's series, we see how people pushed to bring about a safe country for the Jewish people, and how today others are still pushing for safety and change. Do our efforts for change lead to peace and justice...or not? Today, hear a staged reading by Palestine Up-Close exploring the points of view held by "wounded warriors" who were soldiers for the Israeli Defense Forces in Palestine. We discover their struggles as they push for a way to come to terms with their own actions.
