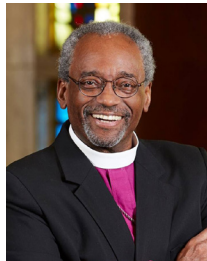
Sunday Forum today: What is Rogation?

Traditionally during Easter, the Church observes time to bless fields, gardens and other agricultural sites. Those days are referred to as "Rogation" days. The term comes from the Latin root, *rogatio*, "to ask." Join Brian Sellers-Petersen, Missioner for Agrarian Ministries in the Diocese of Olympia, and The Rev. Cristi Chapman to learn about rogation and to process around the campus as we observe this ancient Eastertide practice.

Remembrance installation closing reception, presented by the Visual Arts Ministry

Remembrance, a bronze sculptural installation by Midori Saito which spans the length of the newly-created office hallway gallery, will continue to be on display through May 20. Bronze flowers are each formed from a single sheet of metal, cut, folded and bent to create varying floral representations. At first glance, the objects seem fragile and delicate, but as one begins to consider the material of creation the flowers become objects that will not change or fade. Pulling from Japanese Buddhist funerary practices, the installation calls us to consider mourning as a life-long journey. These flowers, made from metal, will stay "fresh", and act as reminders of the enduring relationship between the living and the dead. Join us in the hallway gallery for a closing reception with the artist.

Education for Ministry (EfM) classes for 2018-19

Saint Mark's now has 3 EfM classes! Each are welcoming new students this fall, including those who wish to resume the program. EfM is a four-year seminary-created program for lay people to study scripture, church history, and modern theology. Led by a mentor, classes are seminar-style and connect the material with church tradition, personal experiences, individual beliefs and current events. Three different classes meet weekly September to June at Saint Mark's: Sunday 6:30-8:30 pm, Monday 10 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. or Monday 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. Each class is limited to 12 people; enrollment starts now and ends in early August or when classes are full.
