He has held a variety of leadership roles at Volunteers of America, Tours Northwest Seattle and Chateau Retirement Communities. Adam says, "I was first drawn to Saint Mark's in high school, by the majesty and mystery of Sunday night Compline service. My fondness for the people of Saint Mark's deepened as a member of the Cathedral Choir in the early 2000s, and I have been graced by my connection to the cathedral ever since. I am struck by the intentional way in which the Seattle Service Corps expresses and engages Saint Mark's commitment to social justice. As Canon McLaurin, corps members, cathedral leadership and I begin our work together, I am grateful to the Saint Mark's community for your prayers and support."

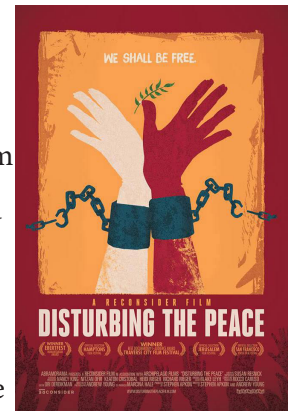
Presiding Bishop to visit Saint Mark's

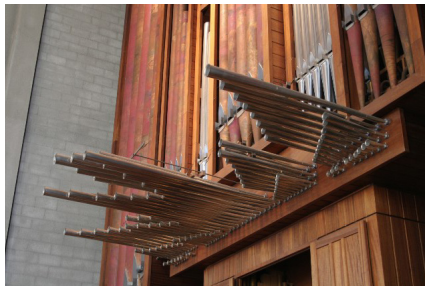
