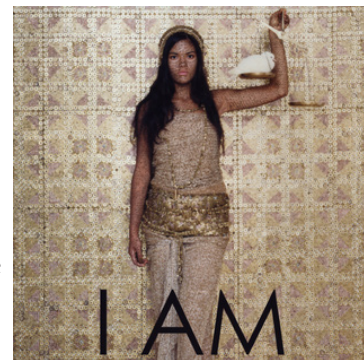

Jesus the Radical Economist: Narrative and Healing

Jesus was a radical economist who challenged the oppressive systems of his time by lifting up the marginalized. Jesus also understood that oppression starts with the body and the body is also the source of healing. What can we learn from the economics of Jesus? What does it mean to heal and what role does narrative play in healing? Drawing from the Gospels, anthropologist David Graeber, and writings from various scholars, Seattle Service Corps member Paige Foreman will lead us in critical look at our economic system and how it influences our attitudes towards oppressed groups using Theatre of the Oppressed techniques.

Remembrance installation closing reception

Remembrance, a bronze sculptural installation by Midori Saito on display in the Cathedral House hallway gallery, will continue through May 20. Bronze flowers are each formed from a single sheet of metal, cut, folded and bent to create varying floral representations. At first glance, the objects seem fragile and delicate, but as one begins to consider the material, the flowers become objects that will not change or fade. Pulling from Japanese Buddhist funerary practices, the installation calls us to consider mourning as a lifelong journey. These flowers, made from metal, will stay "fresh", and act as reminders of the enduring relationship between the living and the dead. Join us in the hallway gallery for a closing reception with the artist.

Education for Ministry (EfM) classes for 2018-19

Saint Mark's now has 3 EfM classes! Each are welcoming new students this fall, including those who wish to resume the program. EfM is a four-year program for lay people to study scripture, church history, and modern theology. Led by a mentor, classes are seminar-style and connect the material with church tradition, personal experiences, individual beliefs and current events.
