Community Briefing on Detained Asylum Seekers—World Refugee Day

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 20, 9:30-11:30 A.M., BLOEDEL HALL

On this annual United Nations World Refugee Day, the magnitude of the humanitarian crisis in our own backyard demands action. On Wednesday morning, Saint Mark's is hosting the Church Council of Greater Seattle's Community Briefing and Action Forum on behalf of the 209 Central American asylum seekers who were transferred to the SeaTac Federal Detention Center last week. They have been detained for over a month without receiving their credible fear interviews and many have been separated from their children and have not been in contact with them for weeks. Speakers include attorneys from the Northwest Immigrant Rights Project (NWIRP), ACLU, and Kids in Need of Defense (KIND). Come learn more and stand up for our commitment to welcome the stranger, as our Scriptures command!

Prayer and Procession from Saint Mark's to Saint James for Families at the Border

This Thursday, June 21, all are invited to join a prayerful vigil and procession beginning at Saint Mark's Episcopal Cathedral and ending at St. James Roman Catholic Cathedral in Seattle. As people of faith, we stand in solidarity with all the migrants and asylum-seekers who come to our borders, fleeing violence or simply seeking a better life for their families. We protest the inhumane separation of children from their parents. This will be an opportunity to gather together for prayer, and to bring our prayerful witness to the streets of our city.
