




“I AM” exhibit opens next Sunday!

"The Detention Lottery" Immersive Theater Production on Immigrant Rights

This immersive theater experience written and enacted by immigration attorneys gives audiences a "first-hand" experience of what it's like to be arrested and detained by ICE officers and sentenced to deportation by an immigration judge. During the performance, you (or your fictional family member) will be detained and have your merit for relief from deportation determined by an immigration judge, followed up by talk-backs led by experienced removal defense attorneys. Gain a greater understanding of our immigration enforcement system and be empowered to stand up for immigrant protections and rights.

Education for Ministry (EfM) classes for 2018-19

Saint Mark's now has 3 EfM classes! Each class is welcoming new students this fall, as well as those who wish to resume the program. EfM is a four-year program for lay people to study scripture, church history, and modern theology. Classes connect the material with church tradition, personal experiences, individual beliefs and current events. Three different classes meet weekly September to June at Saint Mark's: Sunday 6:30-8:30 p.m., Monday 10 a.m.-12:30 p.m. or Monday 6:30-8:30 p.m. Each class is limited to 12 people; enrollment starts now and ends in early August or when classes are full.
