The Cathedral has received a wonderful gift to commission NW artist Julie Speidel to design a new baptistery that fits the spacious cathedral and has running water! The piece incorporates both ancient and modern concepts while celebrating the rich tradition of Christian baptism handed down to us. In this forum, we will describe the design process, theological underpinnings for the design, and next steps. The artist and others involved in the design process will be on hand as well.

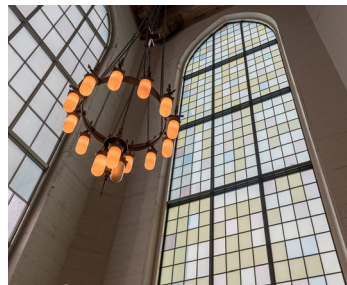
